Behrend Lions Men's Soccer

2008 Season Preview

The Penn State Behrend men's soccer program is energized entering the 2008 season and looking to defend its AMCC championship. Last year, the squad posted a record of 14-5-3 and tied the school record for wins. Now in his sixteenth year, Coach Dan Perritano looks for this season to be a positive one. "Our team has excellent depth and flexibility with many of our players able to play numerous positions," said Perritano. The incoming and veteran player's versatility will allow the blue and white to compete for the AMCC championship.

The senior class has quality players and three will be returning in 2008 for one final season. Forward Ahmad Salim (Cranberry/Seneca Valley), midfielder Mike Seth (Pittsburgh/Baldwin), and defender Marcus Taylor (Landisville/Hempfield), bring big game experience and will provide the leadership to make another run at the AMCC championship.

The junior class is lead by first team All-AMCC goalkeeper Dustin Walker (Apollo/Kiski Area). Walker had an impressive 0.45 goals against average and six shutouts a season ago. Along with Walker, are returning defenders Bryan Margaria (Avella/Trinity) and Brian Silfee (McMurray/Peters Township). Both add veteran attitudes and skills to the table. Coming off an injury that prevented him from playing his junior year, Keith DeNinno (Allison Park/Hampton) will look to make his return and being an important part of the defensive core. DeNinno was a starter in every game as a sophomore. "We feel good about our mix of veteran experience and youthful enthusiasm with this team," Perritano said.

Second year players have a ton of talent and look to be an asset for the blue and white. Forward Ryan Banks (Allison Park/Hampton) will come in to help out the offense efforts. While Brian Bodnar (Murrysville/Franklin Regional), Kenneth Gorman (Cranberry/Seneca Valley), Nick Spring (Erie/Harborcreek), Lance Sabol (North Huntingdon/Norwin), and Joshua Teti (McKeesport/Elizabeth Forward) will push for midfield positions. Defenders Zach Herd (Stow, OH/Stow-Munroe Falls) and Jordan Hoffay (McKees Rocks/Montour) will help secure the Behrend defense. Defender/Midfielder Zach Ohl (Cochranon/Cochranon) adds experience to the blue and white.

The blue and white brought in a skillful group of freshmen. "Our young talent mixed with the veterans will allow the Behrend Lions to compete at a high level in the AMCC this fall," said Perritano. Forwards Phillip Broadus (Pittsburgh/Allderdice), Corey Burick (Erie/Iroquois), Mike Fiscus (Russell/Eisenhower), RJ Lewis (Washington/Bishop Canevin), and Jared Potts (Conway/Freedom) will be good additions to the front line of the Behrend Lions. Controlling the midfield are Ryan Armahizer (Butler/Butler), Aaron Meehl (North East/North East), Cory Neiderer (State College/Penns Valley), and Brad Nowosielski (Pittsburgh/Hampton). The future of the back line for the blue and white starts with defender Kyle McKinney (Chesterland/West Geauga), and Dave Revtai (McKees Rocks/Montour). Two goalkeepers, Sean Neely (Pittsburgh/North Hills) and Mike Stevens (Pittsburgh/Seneca Valley), add depth to the position.

The blue and white will open the season with two tournaments. The annual Herb Lauffer Memorial Tournament is set for August 30 and 31. The following weekend they will travel to Fredonia State to play in a top-notch Division III kick-off tournament. Conference play will begin on September 27 for the blue and white. With the league having such a competitive balance Coach Perritano believes that the key will be finding the right system. Behrend closes out the league slate with three late October home games before preparing for the league playoffs on November 1. The AMCC Finals are scheduled for November 8.

"We have players who love to compete and are showing a willingness to improve and enjoy playing the game," said Perritano. In 2008, the AMCC will be very balanced. The Behrend Lions have made eight finals appearance, winning four titles in 1997, 1999, 2003 and 2007. After finishing with the school record for wins with 14 a year ago, the blue and white are focused on raising the bar again in 2008.

The TOPSoccer program was started in 2001 by men and women's soccer coaches Dan Perritano and Patrick O'Driscoll. TOPSoccer is a community-based program developed by the U.S. Youth Soccer Association to give children with disabilities the opportunity to learn and play soccer. The program is currently going on its eighth season.

Children participate in an eight-week program that runs from March to May. They meet once a week on Wednesday nights in the Junker Center. Each week the child participates in basic soccer skills and small sided games. There are also other activities for children to take a break from soccer. "The main focus of TOPSoccer is to give the participants a chance to be active and hopefully learn a bit about soccer," said coach O'Driscoll. "The real reward is the experience for all involved and the special relationship that often forms between the participant and volunteer coach." The eight week program concludes with a pizza party and awards ceremony.

Volunteers for the program have generally come from the men and women's soccer teams until recent years. Now volunteers are from a wide variety of sports such as volleyball, men and women's basketball, track & field, and water polo, as well as other Behrend students. Recently, other programs have been added to TOPSoccer, for parents and siblings of participants. One feature is the sibling swim program, in which brothers and sisters of participants can enjoy the Junker pool. Another feature to the program is a speakers' series designed for parents of special needs children.

Coaching Profiles

Head Coach Dan Perritano

Dan Perritano is embarking on his sixteenth year as the head coach of the men's soccer program. He has guided the team to ten winning seasons in the last twelve years, including four Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference Championships, in 1997, 1999, 2003, and 2007. Perritano's 162 wins as the men's soccer coach make him the winningest coach in the history of the program, which began in 1960. He has twice been selected by his peers as AMCC Coach of the Year, with those honors coming in 1997 and 2003.

Last season, the Behrend Lions tied the school record for wins earning a 14-5-3 record en route to the 2007 AMCC Title and a berth into the NCAA Tournament. In 2005, the blue and white went 12-7 overall and earned a berth in the ECAC Tournament, which marked the third time since 2000 the squad advanced beyond the AMCC Tournament.

In 2003, the blue and white flourished under Perritano's direction. The team earned their third AMCC conference tournament championship with a 1-0 win over Frostburg. Perritano earned his second honor as AMCC Coach of the Year while the program posted a school record 14 wins and advanced to the first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

Perritano was also the Behrend women's soccer coach for nine seasons, from 1995 to 2003. Prior to the 2004 season, to strengthen his program, coach Perritano relinquished his duties as head women's soccer coach at Behrend after an incredible run to focus on the men's program. As women's coach the Behrend Lions dominated the conference winning four AMCC championships and placed second in another three. They earned three bids to the ECAC Tournament and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. His women's record at Behrend stands at 109-57-11 to go along with a 58-20-4 women's mark from two previous coaching stops.

Perritano enters the 2008 season with 311 men's and women's coaching victories in his illustrious career. He also holds an NSCAA Premier Diploma, USSF "B" and National Youth Coaching Licenses, and a Brazilian Football Federation Coaching Certificate.

His interest in the game goes beyond coaching. In the summer of 2006 Perritano took the Behrend men to Germany to compete and experience the culture of the host nation of the 2006 FIFA World Cup. In the summer of 2005 Perritano coached several of the region's finest Division III players in five games in Brazil including a contest in Maracana Stadium. He has attended both the European Cup Finals in London in 1996 and the World Cup Finals in 1994 in Los Angeles and has served on the NCAA Northeast region Selection Committee and as a coaching clinician and state coach for PA West ODP as well as guest coaching at various camps and clinics including a summer 2003 soccer camp in Alaska. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Perritano is also a lecturer of health and physical education.

Assistant Coach Bryan Blaszczyk

Bryan Blaszczyk is entering his second year as assistant coach for the Behrend Lions. He was a team captain and four-year starter for the blue and white from 2002 to 2006. During his career at Behrend he was a three time AMCC All-Conference team selection as well as receiving Great Lakes All-Region honors as a senior. Blaszczyk has been a coach of the Lake Erie Soccer Club for five years, four of which he has been head coach.

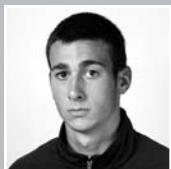

Athletic Facilities

Behrend Fields

The college's soccer teams compete on the Behrend Fields, located northwest of the baseball and softball complex and across the bridge over Trout Run.

The complex comprises four multi-purpose athletic fields and a putting green. The facility was created in 1988, thanks to a pacesetting gift of \$1.4 million from an anonymous donor. The fields are also used for intramurals and course instruction. They accommodate a variety of play configurations, including flag football and softball.

Other outdoor facilities on campus include lighted tennis courts and sand volleyball courts.

Junker Center

The growth of athletics at Penn State Behrend has led to the development of new indoor facilities. The \$10.2 million Junker Center, which opened in the spring of 2001, comprises 72,800 square feet, including outstanding volleyball and basketball facilities.

The center features three all-purpose courts and a gymnasium seating 1,600, an eight-lane swimming pool, three-lane running track, jumping pits, aerobics room, locker rooms, offices, and a variety of exercise equipment. The fully equipped Jageman Fitness Room provides a variety of exercise equipment for students, faculty, and staff.



Baseball and Softball Complex

Penn State Behrend's baseball and softball complex, located adjacent to the main campus entrance, ranks as one of the region's best facilities.

Each field features a built-in irrigation system, seventy-foot in-ground dugouts, batting cages, bullpens, scoreboards, a full warning track, permanent fences, a concession stand, and scorekeepers' stations.
